## INDIRECT OBJECT PRONOUNS

- You can use a pronoun instead of a person, or person's name, when that person is receiving the thing of an action.
- Puede usar un pronombre en lugar de una persona, o el nombre de la persona, cuando esa persona está recibiendo la acción.
